



## FALLING FOR WINE COUNTRY

WITH ACRES OF ROLLING VINEYARDS, WILD HORSES ROAMING ON DESERT HILLS AND FAMILY-RUN WINERIES, OLIVER OSOYOOS IS THE PERFECT DESTINATION FOR A WINE-TASTING WEEKEND.

ORME, OSOYOOS CONJURES MEMORIES of childhood camping trips with my mother, father and brother where we would spend our days swimming in the freshwater lake, horseback riding along desert paths and playing rounds of mini golf. And while a recent trip proved that parts (including the mini golf course) of the area haven't changed a bit, a visit to Oliver Osoyoos' quaint wineries and a stay at a sun-drenched hilltop resort demonstrated that the region is all grown up—and is the ideal spot for a weekend sipping local wines while soaking in those last rays few rays of summer.

SLEEP | A short drive up Anarchist Mountain past acres of vineyards brings you to the adobe-style Spirit Ridge at NK'Mip Resort. Overlooking Osoyoos Lake, North America's only Aboriginal owned and

operated winery and resort is a celebration of the Osoyoos Indian Band's cultural and natural beauty-and staying there offers a soul-soothing experience. While the resort itself, with its terracotta coloured exterior, fragrant purple robed locust trees and desert sage hills evokes the Arizona desert, the acres of lush vineyards made me feel as if I was in Tuscany. With two sparkling pools, a nine-hole golf course, spa, suites equipped with barbecues, fully stocked kitchens, full-size fridges (for chilling all of the Okanagan wines you purchase) and a cultural centre on site, Spirit Ridge provides a peaceful-yet-stimulating home base for a family, corporate or friend weekend away. spiritridge.ca

DINE | Steps away from the Spirit Ridge Resort lobby is the entrance to Nk'Mip Cellars (asting room, along with one of the most romantic places you will surely ever dine: the Nk'Mip Cellars patio. A short walk through the tasting room, featuring high ceilings, a mosaic floor and church-like stained glass windows brought our group to the threshold of a small patio and garden where I literally gasped at the beauty of the long table set with hundreds of sparkling wine glasses, backed by a grassy area overlooking acres of vineyards and Osovoos Lake. A few steps further and we were greeted by Chef Orlin Godfrey, who offered us a glass of Nk'Mip's refreshing pinot blanc along with fresh shucked oysters dressed with his homemade peach vinegar and pickled red onion mignonette. The long table dinner that followed, featuring traditional bannock, burrata and local





favourite "Dreamcatcher" and tender braised beef short ribs, was equally magical. Experience it for yourself: long nkmipcellars.com/About-Us

Another unforgettable dining experience took place at Tinhorn Creek's Miradoro restaurant. The evening after in a van, or hire horses, or electric bikes to bring you from running 18 kilometres at the ninth annual Half Corked Marathon, which, as the name suggests, includes stops for wine tastings (often by costume-clad participants) our group dined on a light-yet-filling Mediterranean meal with Asian influences while taking in panoramic vistas from the restaurant's dining room. Chef Jeff Van Geest's seared Ahi tuna and spiralized zucchini starter, followed by a succulent grilled pork chop, lentil and cabbage ragu main course satisfied our post-race protein needs, and were excellent paired with Tinhorn's Oldfield Series 2 Bench Red 2012. The rich Plum Tiramisu and open-air performance by The Boom Booms as part of Tinhorn's Summer Concert Series (which runs until September 9), were a perfect ending to a perfectly exhilarating day. tinhorn.com

Each year, its myriad quaint, and often familytable dinners are open to the public on weekends, while run, wineries open their doors to visitors to come in and regular lunch is served daily on the patio until October 9. enjoy their wines. > Whether you opt to explore the region by organized tour stop to stop, the experience rivals anything you could do in Europe's wine regions. On our trip we opted for electric bikes from Heatstroke Cycle and a van from Top Cat tours to bring us to some of Oliver Osovoos Wine Association's 39 member wineries including Hester Creek (the fruity patio-perfect trebbiano sells out every year), Platinum Bench Estate Winery & Artisan Bread Company (the
